### A MIRACULOUS RECOVERY

When 6-year-old Luna came to BHRSC last summer, she was in desperate need of medical care.

And it was not a typical problem like an infection or a skin condition – she was paralyzed in her back legs and had been for almost a month, after an injury that occurred on the Fourth of July.

BHRSC volunteers immediately sought a foster home while scheduling appointments with a veterinary neurologist.



Thankfully, a family who was on the BHRSC adoption waitlist decided to foster Luna!

"We took her in and took care of her those first couple weeks, then Basset Hound Rescue took her in to see the vet and the neurologist," foster mom Theresa said. "She had her surgery in mid-August to repair a ruptured disc that was compressing her spine."

When the vet went in for the surgery, there was more damage to

### • LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT •

Happy Fall, basset lovers!

We have been busy since I wrote my last letter to you. The truth is, every year is busy: Helping homeless hounds is a year-round effort that requires many hours of work by those in our all-volunteer organization.

We have volunteers who oversee hounds coming into rescue, including those who come to us as a result of owners surrendering their dogs, as well as shelter dogs. Especially time-intensive are our regular Hound Hauls, twhere we have a team of people handling the logistics of bringing homeless hounds from out of state and getting them promptly into foster homes.

Every hound that comes into our rescue goes to one of our vets for a checkup and to receive needed medical care. Not infrequently, our hounds need referrals to specialty vets, and we have volunteers who arrange that. Each hound has a volunteer team that assesses their behavior so these dogs are set up for success.

We have other volunteers who screen every foster and adoption applicant, and who follow up with fosters and adoptees to answer questions and troubleshoot medical or behavioral issues.

We staff a hotline and an email account to answer questions from the public about BHRSC. We also have a team that sends out regular email updates and writes and produces this newsletter. There is also a web team that runs our website and manages many technical issues.

Even with volunteers, saving hounds costs a lot of money. So, of course, we have a team of volunteers who work on fundraising.

You know about our major fundraising events. In the spring, we hold our annual Spring Games. As I write this, our fall fundraiser, Bids & Bites for Bassets, is only weeks away. We also hold online fundraisers, such as the ones with Krispy Kreme and Pearls for Pups, and apply for grants.

Finally, because all work and no play is not in keeping with our favorite breed, we host several get togethers a year: Valentine's Day, Beach Day and Halloween, to name a few.

And we do all this with no paid staff. This tremendous amount of work outlined above (and more) is undertaken by BHRSC solely through volunteers.

BHRSC needs more volunteers to continue to do our important work. We have many volunteers staffing multiple positions. We'd like to bring in more volunteers to not only lighten their load but help us with new and creative ideas.

Our positions range from being hands on with the hounds to positions that can be handled solely from a computer and phone. We need people with computer skills, people who like to write, people who can solicit donations from businesses, people who can drive our hounds to vet appointments or long distances for our hound hauls. We also especially need people willing to roll up their sleeves to help us put on our bigger events, such as Spring Games.

Luna's spinal cord than he had initially thought from the MRI.

"After the surgery, we were told she had a 50/50 chance of walking again, so we weren't quite sure what to expect, but we were hopeful," Theresa said.


Their hope turned into reality, and after months of rest and then physical therapy, Luna started walking again!

BHRSC spent more than \$10,000 on Luna's diagnostics, surgery, physical therapy, and continued medical care.

At Bids & Bites for Bassets on Sept. 23, 2023, Luna attended as our featured hound. More than \$56,000 was raised to help hounds like Luna!

"She lives a very normal life now - she runs and jumps."



### What does the Hotline Coordinator do?

The hotline coordinator answers all phone communications coming into the Basset Hound Rescue Hotline, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

#### How did you get involved?



## **NEW WAYS TO DONATE**

### BHRSC IS NOW ABLE TO RECEIVE SECURITIES AS DONATIONS

If you have securities that you've owned for a long time, you may have a very low-cost basis and you would incur large capital gains if you sold those assets. If you are inclined to donate to the Basset Hound Rescue of Southern California, it may make sense to consider a donation of appreciated marketable securities that you have held for more than one year instead of cash.

analyze your philanthropic goals and tax planning for 2023. Tax benefits should never drive the decision to give, but tax planning can ensure that you take advantage of all the incentives in the Tax Code, while benefitting the homeless hounds rescued by BHRSC.

A gift of appreciated securities (stocks, mutual funds, bonds) to a public charity like the Basset Hound Rescue of Southern California may help you avoid paying a tax on the built-in capital gains and may help maximize your charitable deduction for the tax year.
